## What Does the Data Tell Us?

- District assessment data indicates a high number of our students are "on-track" in reading, writing, and numeracy but we need to focus on moving students from emerging towards proficient and extending
- FSA data trends indicate that SD10 is above provincial average in both grade 4 and grade 7 in reading, writing, and numeracy
- Graduation rates fluctuate due to small cohorts, so we must focus on each individual learner to ensure success
- Need to focus on post secondary transitions, career options, transition to trades

### NUMBER OF IMPORTANT ADULTS AT SCHOOL


