### 2. Nakusp Child Care Centre – Construction about to begin!

- Seven competitive bids were received on the project RFP for the new Child Care Centre HUB
- Cormac Projects from Calgary was awarded the tender as successful bidder at \$1,884,330 for



 project construction – keeping the project on budget!
Cormac will begin work over the next couple of weeks and has indicated substantive construction completion will be done within 24 weeks or 6 months followed by final rectification and finishing

 Local trade contractors will be subcontracted as per Cormac's bid

This is indeed exciting and almost "groundbreaking" news!

#### 3. After School Child Care – early April to June

- Last week our schools commenced free accessible after school child care through exciting arts and recreation programming at NES, Lucerne, Burton and Edgewood schools
- All schools report strong interest and appreciation from K-7 parents and families for these creative arts, outdoor learning and recreation after school activities
- Many thanks to our elementary principals and vice principals, Justin Bisson, Brent Cook, Nick Graves and Mike Hibberson for their outreach to community artists and resources and putting together quality learning experiences for our children!

  - BES 1 or 2 days a week (primary art/music intermediate)

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## 4. Rural Recruitment and Retention Think Tank - May 5th

- Recruitment of teachers, principals and vice-principals, and senior district staff continues to be a major concern in rural school districts across BC including SD 10
- In 2011, sixteen school districts formed a Rural Advisory Education Committee to address rural issues, highlight rural innovation, and create rural networks
- In partnership with the Ministry of Education and as part of REA, we have co-created a Recruitment and Retention Think Tank looking at creative ways we might strengthen recruitment for educators in rural

## 5. 2021-22 Budget Consultation Update

- Budget consultation continues with partners from the Finance Committee having met April 20<sup>th</sup> for the third and final time with the Board
- Senior staff shared Scenario 1 a mostly "status quo" budget which also includes collective agreement increases for teachers and CUPE staff as well as other known increased costs (projected to use \$456,840 of the accumulated surplus of \$1,652,707 (less amended budget projected use of surplus of \$289,679)
- On April 20<sup>th</sup> the Finance Committee also reviewed Scenario 2 which includes additional COVID cleaning hours for bus drivers and custodians

The next step is for the Board to review the Finance Committee recommendations, meet with senior staff, look at student achievement data and the Strategic Plan, and come up with a final budget slated for April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2021

#### 6. Battle of the Books at NES

- Literacy with a competitive edge happened again this year with intermediate teams from NES battling for their favourite books in Battle of the Books, an international reading incentive program
- > Students demonstrated first rate skills in reading, critical thinking and presenting their arguments
- Thanks to teacher librarian, Megan Martin for her leadership in organizing and supporting the annual competition and to ace judges, Mr. Hibberson and Mr. Dubinsky

# 7. Capital Project Approvals from Ministry of Education

- We are very excited to have received approval for more capital projects from the Ministry Capital Branch as follows:

   Facility Name
   Program Project Description
   Amount
  - At NES: \$980,000 for a School Envelope Program (SEP) Exterior Wall System for greater energy efficiency which will involve a renovation of existing school space and demolition of the Strong Start portable to make way for a new addition
  - At BES \$400,000 for replacement of the school roof and installation of solar panels under the SEP program
  - At NSS: \$500,000 for significant upgrade of the HVAC boiler system for greater energy conservation for heating and cooling

# 8. Celebrating Earth Day at the Snk'mip Marsh – April 15, 2021

- In celebration of Earth Day and integrating both Western and Indigenous knowledge and worldviews, Lucerne's K-7 students and staff journeyed to Snk'mip Marsh for a day of deep learning
- > The focus was on deep learning about sustainability and walking on the earth gently
- ▶ K-7s in multi-age teams were led by student leaders, learning in five stations through the day:
  - 1. Cooking and eating bannock with local Indigenous Elder, Eloise Charet
    - 2. Field studies of birds at marsh edge with birder and former NSS teacher, Gary Davidson
  - 3. Sinixt goose egg gathering stories and games with Sinixt Elder, Marilyn James and KL Kivi
  - 4. Conifer tree and cone identification field studies with local biologist, Heather
  - Indigenous drumming and songs with Indigenous EA, Jess Britton; music specialist, Leah Holden and Sinixt stick dancing with Al Richardson

Sinixt Elder, Marilyn James welcomed all to the gathering. As geese honked in the marsh below, Marilyn told stories of traditionalSinixt practices each spring gathering of goose eggs for food .



## 9. Compliance Audit for ALDL School

We've received notification from the Ministry of Education that a compliance audit for ALDL will be held during the week of May 17<sup>th</sup>

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- The district had been scheduled for a DL School Audit last spring which was deferred as a result of COVID
