I raised the topic of the four day school week in my report to PAC. It was discussed at length. The members in attendance were in favour of the District exploring this option but also wanted it noted that the five parents, and two staff members, in attendance would not be negatively affected by a four day week. The factors that would make them say either 'yes' or 'no', were the same issues - the length of the school day, financial hardships for child care; for parents that don't use child care perhaps social/emotional hardships; what about vulnerable children that need somewhere to go, school is a safe haven; could interfere with high-school sports; financial hardships for affected staff. If all of these issue were adequately considered and it benefited all, not just a few, they would say yes.
